Keynote Speakers

Dr. Stephen Hart

Dr. Hart is an internationally recognized expert in the field of assessment and management of violence risk. He is also a professor of Psychology at Simon Fraser University, Canada. Stephen has conducted training for legal, law enforcement, corrections and mental health professionals throughout North America, Europe, Asia, and Australia. Having graduated with a Ph.D. in clinical and forensic psychology from the University of British Columbia, Stephen has authored or co-authored 150 scientific books, chapters and articles. Stephen has provided expert testimony before courts and tribunals at all judicial levels throughout North America.

Dr. Veronique Valliere

Dr. Valliere is a licensed psychologist and has her doctorate in Clinical Psychology from the Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology of Rutgers University. She has over 20 years experience in the field and has worked in individual and group treatment with violent offenders and their victims, including domestic violence offenders, sexual offenders and victims, violent offenders, and substance abusers. She also serves on the Pennsylvania Sexual Offender Assessment Board and has been reappointed twice. She has published on the treatment and dynamics of sexual offenders and presented on the same at national and local sexual offender conferences. She has trained Pennsylvania State Parole agents on the Supervision of the Violent Offenders, presented for the National Center for the Prosecution of Violence Against Women, trained judges, state police officers, and polygraphers. She has been a guest presenter at numerous forensic and abuse conferences, appeared on television, and was interviewed for Good Housekeeping, People and Self magazine .

Dr. Peter Collins

Dr. Peter Collins is a Canadian forensic psychiatrist. He is an expert on violent crime and has worked with criminal justice agencies in Canada and throughout the world, including INTERPOL, the FBI and U.S. Department of Homeland Security, the Australian Federal Police and Europol. He frequently testifies as an expert witness on sexual homicide, pedophilia, child pornography, stalking, sexual assault, paraphilias, the insanity defense, suicide by cop, police crisis negotiations and post-traumatic stress disorder.

Collins became an in-house consultant to the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), in 1995, and is currently the Coordinator of the Forensic Psychiatry Team of the Behavioural Sciences and Analysis Section of the OPP. He is also a consultant psychiatrist to the Integrated National Security Enforcement Team (INSET) of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, the Consultant Forensic Psychiatrist to the Profiling Unit of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and to the Behavioural Sciences Team of the Calgary Police Service. Collins has been a member of the Toronto Police Service Emergency Task Force (ETF) Crisis Negotiation Team since 1992.
